## Executive Summary

The rural economy is the backbone of the Indian economy. SBI Foundation, the philanthropic arm of SBI has been instrumental in transforming the rural landscape across India. In Karnataka, it selected five backward villages from Mundargi taluk of Gadag district. Many villages in Mundargi have been drought-affected for the last few decades. Sankalpa Rural Development Society in association with the SBI Foundation team has worked hard to change the face of these villages in the last three years, beginning October 2020 until September 2023.

A village is not just about agriculture. It is about education, skill development, entrepreneurship, health and well-being and agriculture-allied professions which will boost the overall socio-economic-environmental growth of the village. SRDS under the SBI Grama Seva project has undertaken all of these programs in a dedicated disciplined manner to benefit all sections of the village. Extensive stakeholder consultations were held to select the initiatives, decide the locations, finalise the beneficiaries, set up and manage self-help groups and negotiate the scope of projects to bring about holistic development.

It is a matter of great pride that we have been able to make a significant impact over the span of 3 years in the fields of:

- Digitalization for availing of Government schemes
- Education: Personality development, smart classrooms, skill development for youth
- Livelihood: Vocational training in tailoring, and embroidery for women
- Agriculture: Resilient agriculture, sustainable water management, tree-based farming
- Agriculture-allied: Bee-keeping, livestock rearing
- Rural infrastructure: Toilets, libraries, solar electrification, yoga centre, anganwadis
- Health: Health camps, mobile health vans going to the doorsteps of villagers

## 1. DIGITALIZATION - SBI Grama Seva Kendra

SBI Gram Seva Kendras have been successfully run under the Gram Seva Program with an objective to facilitate various online services, schemes/facilities of the Government like Aadhaar card, job openings and banking services etc. to rural communities. It acts as the nodal point for all the essential community services.

Gram Seva Kendras have been setup in the 5 adopted villages and have been well equipped with LED Screens, computers, furniture and stationery. The centers have been provided with colors printers and lamination machines. Notice boards have been placed outside as a ready reckoner of available schemes. The Gram Seva Kendra has served as a Knowledge sharing platform for various Livelihood Interventions, Promotion of Youth Development through different E-Learning programs.

## Outcome

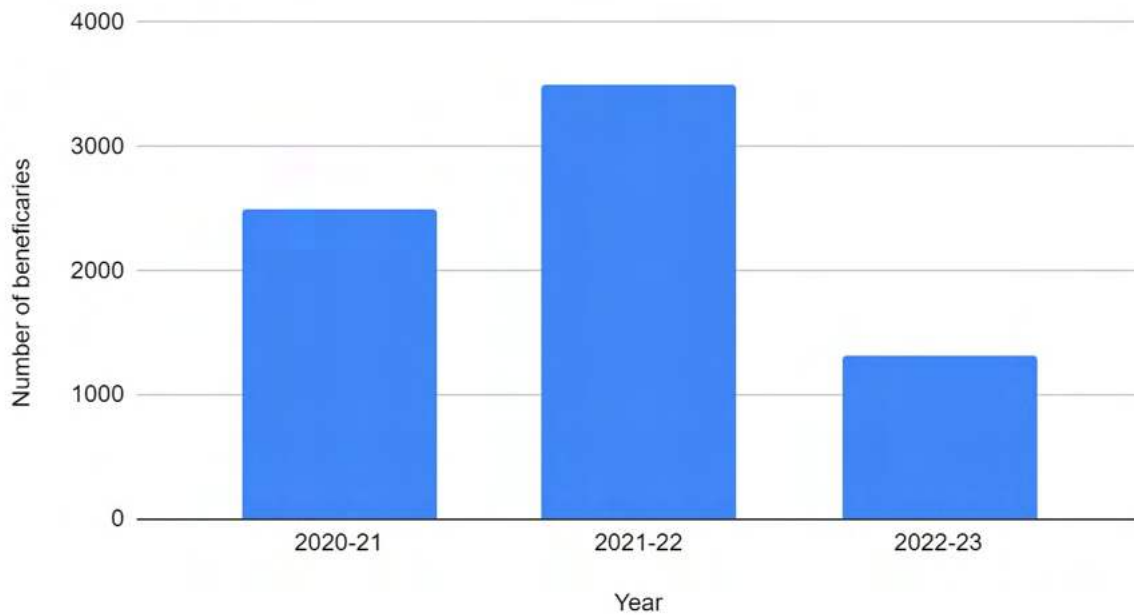
When our team visited all five villages and enquired about the impact, we found that many rural women have got bank accounts and are now getting government facilities including free schemes by Siddaramaiah government which was introduced recently in Karnataka.

**Case study:** A woman Sharanavva Maranabasari from Tamragundi said that she did not have a bank account or Aadhar card. SBI Gram Seva Kendra staff helped them to open an account and now she has a bank account, and she is taking government facilities. Sharanavva said, “I am happy that I have Aadhar card and bank account, and I am getting government facilities. Before, I had to go to the taluka to open an account, so I had not opened it. Now SBI Foundation staff has opened a center in our own village, and we are all thankful to them.”

## Sustainability Plan

Token fees/ Community Contribution were collected from beneficiaries for sustainability of the program. Amount collected till date: **Rs. 1,17,007 from 7,260+ beneficiaries**. Up till now, the Gram Sevak was paid a salary from the grant amount. Going forward, the running of the GSK will be assigned to a responsible person and he/she will charge affordable amounts for services provided. SRDS will reasonably verify the amounts collected and also check the working and maintenance of equipment provided.

## 2. EDUCATION

Education forms the bedrock for the development of any society. A number of initiatives were put in place to improve the overall educational level, learning outcomes and employment opportunities of the children and youth of the villages.

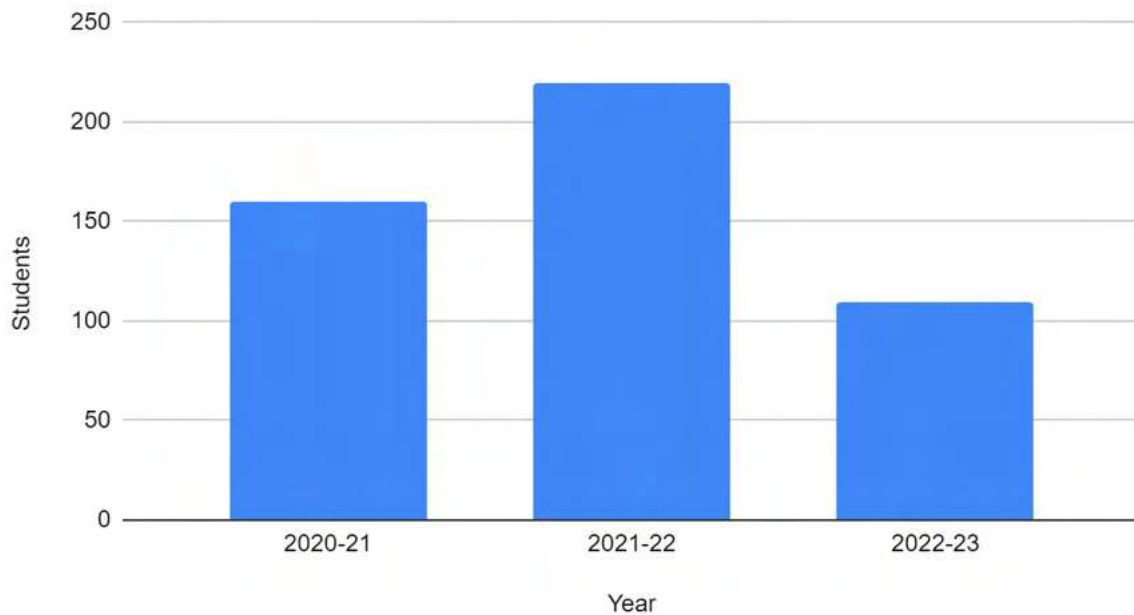
### i) Remedial Classes

**Need:** Usually in cities, parents have some level of education. Hence they enquire from their children about the day's learning at school and help them complete their homework. Nowadays, many parents send their children to tuitions to supplement their learning. However, in villages, neither are parents educated nor are tuitions present. Children are left to themselves to read. The common scenario is going to play soon after school ends and opening their books only the next day in school. Therefore, remedial classes were started to teach students how to learn.



**150 students** benefit regularly from remedial classes across the 5 adopted villages. The students can clear their academic doubts and are encouraged to inculcate discipline, cleanliness and good habits in their daily routine. They are being taught painting, general knowledge, cultural activities, sports and extra-curricular activities. Considering the sustainability of the intervention, the remedial teacher under the supervision of the Gram Committee has started taking token fees from the community.

### ii) SBI Ojas Rural Scholarship

**Need:** Due to high poverty levels and very basic facilities in rural Government schools, there is little incentive for meritorious students to aim high. Many times, they have to drop out of higher education. Hence the SBI Ojas Rural Scholarship with a cash prize was constituted to recognize the top performers among high-school students to motivate them to study further.

**In 2021, 6 students** were selected amongst many in the villages for their special talent and according to their achievements in their specific fields like sports, education, cultural activities etc. Students were able to buy books or sports equipment of their choice to further their pursuits.

On 26<sup>th</sup> January 2023, 5 certificates were distributed to approved nominees of scholarship holders in Harogeri village with instructions to open SBI accounts. In total, x students have received the Scholarship from SBI Foundation.

### iii) Smart Class Room / Computer Labs

**Need:** Smart classrooms are a very urban, tier-1 city phenomenon. Teachers and parents of such children voice their happiness over improved learning outcomes when children are exposed to such interactive multimedia modes of teaching. However, smart classrooms have not made inroads into rural areas. In the selected villages of Gadag and beyond, the smart class introduced by SRDS with the support of SBI Foundation, opened a whole new world to the children.

In November 2021, SRDS installed a smart classroom in the high school in Harogeri village. The entire curriculum of the 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> standards have been fed into the system. Teachers feel that there is an increased participation of students as the smart classroom is more engaging and fun to learn with. Teachers have also witnessed that students are more interactive and helps students to remember things easily. Currently this smart class is helping 8th, 9th and 10th grade students.

Every year, a total **150 students** from the respective high school classes take the benefit of Smart classroom & approximately **50 students** from the Computer Lab.

#### iv) Library / Science Equipment

**Need for library:** Our cities abound with book stores. All urban schools have libraries for students to gain non-academic knowledge or immerse themselves in a good story book. However, rural students have no such facilities. They make do with just the school books provided by the school. Hence, it was decided to set up a library at Peta-Alur.

**Need for science lab:** Rural students are by nature very curious and resourceful. They have an in-born ability to experiment. However, with the minimum practical learning equipment available in their schools, they cannot see theory coming to life, limiting their understanding of concepts. Therefore, it was decided to set up a Science Lab with all types of equipment for classes 8 to 10 to practically understand their physics, chemistry, maths and biology lessons.

The building of the Peta-Alur Library was a 100 year old building in the centre of the village. SRDS renovated it to create a good library where both children and adults are coming to spend time reading. The Science Laboratory established in October 2021. In February 2022, a science laboratory was inaugurated at Harogeri village. All students get to work in the lab twice a week. The lab is quipped to serve more than **150 students** every year.

**Beneficiary quote:** The Head-Master of the school at Harogeri has this to say. “We are now flooded with new admissions because of the Science Lab. Children from the surrounding villages are also seeking admission into our school. Now we have to arrange for extra benches and desks!”.

**v) Extra-curricular Events**



*Regular events are conducted at all the schools, including drawing and quiz competitions, especially during national festivals. Cash prizes were given to the winners.*

**Outcome**

When we checked with the youth on digital platforms knowledge they are now well versed with the current affairs and other happenings in the country through digital libraries. Some students who have learned MS Office are now working in Gadag and surrounding places.

These smart classrooms started infotainment programs with computer literacy to 8th, 9th and 10th students which helped students learn easily. Library and Science equipment created excitement among rural pupils to attend classes more attentively and easily learn the subjects.

**Case study:** Our team met many students in school and asked them about the new smart classes and the way of infotainment. In Harogeri, a smart class was installed in November 2021. All the students are happy as they learned with fun and there is improvement in attendance too. Some students said, “We are happy to learn computers in our school. Earlier we did not have any computers or any other good equipment. All students are enjoying these new techniques”.

**Remedial classes and computer labs:** Students are already being charged nominal amounts for the classes. SRDS will appoint teachers and trainers to conduct the remedial classes and computer labs. They will charge slightly higher yet affordable fees and earn their income. SRDS will perform monitoring and supervision on a regular basis to ensure maximum children and students are benefited.

### 3. HEALTH

#### i) Health camps

**Need:** Like the education sector, rural healthcare has also remained underdeveloped. Under the SBI Foundation's Grama Seva program, SRDS selected the most backward and interior villages which were not reached by the public bus service. Residents of these villages were in dire need of medical services, especially the women folk who hesitated to tell their problems to men. When the proposal of health camps was put forth to the villagers, they were all too keen to cooperate.

SRDS, in collaboration with SBI foundation staff, has organized many health camps like Cataract/ Eye check-up, Gynecological tests, Cancer screening, and Blood analysis, along with Ayurveda health camps in all the villages. The camps were conducted once a month in each village. Here are the recent camps conducted.

- November 2022 – Conducted Ayurvedic camp with collaboration of RDPR in Basapur. **Total beneficiaries: 115**
- December 2022 - Conducted Ayurvedic camp with collaboration of RDPR in Peta Alur. **Total beneficiaries: 130**
- March 2023 – Conducted 2 Medical camps along with blood donation drive in Harogeri & Basapur. **Total beneficiaries: 126, Blood donors: 8.**
- April 2023 – Conducted 2 medical in Haorgeri. **Total beneficiaries: 33**
- August 2023 – Free medical camp in Kelur. **Total beneficiaries: 140, Donors: 8**

#### ii) SBI Sanjivini - Mobile Medical Vans

**Need:** The health camps were conducted once a month. However, when SRDS consulted with the villagers about the benefits, they requested that a doctor come to their village at least once a week. There were many children and senior citizens who would fall ill frequently and currently the village was not visited by any doctors on a regular basis. Thus, the idea of the SBI Sanjivini Mobile Medical Van was put in place to provide primary health services at the doorsteps of the villagers.

The SBI Sanjivini Mobile Medical Van Primary Health Services reached the doorstep of vulnerable and marginalized communities. It provided the triple benefits of timely medical diagnosis and care, reducing patient walk-ins at Government health centers and the availability of a medical van easily for use during emergencies. The Sanjivini Mobile Medical Van provided a low-cost solution to all of the villagers' health needs, especially those in remote villages. It gives patients faster access to healthcare providers and improves medication adherence.

## Outcome

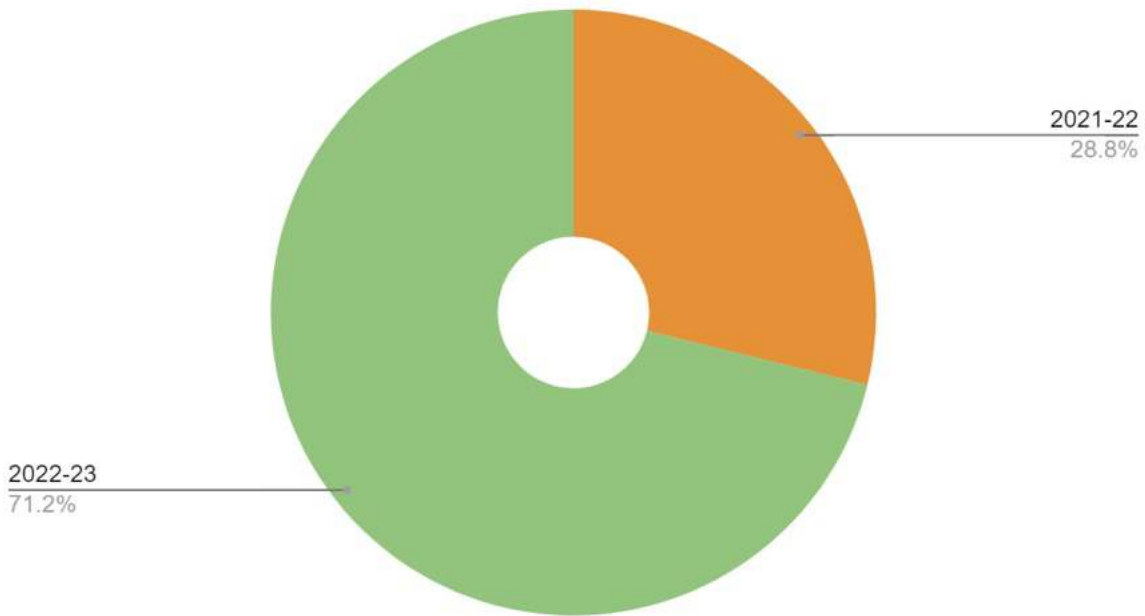
**Case study:** A seventy-year-old woman from Harogeri said, “I was suffering from acute knee pain for the last two years. SBI Foundation and RDPR University conducted a health camp. Earlier I did not agree to go for Ayurveda medicines for my knee pain as I had visited any doctors. But my children forced me to visit the health camp which is free. The staff gave me a herbal medicine bottle and I was advised to consume the same every day morning for three months. After three months I have started walking on my own and I am thankful to organizers”.

**Case study:** A patient who recovered after taking the help of SBI Sanjeevini said, “My octogenarian father was serious and needed to be admitted to the hospital. SBI Sanjeevini staff immediately rushed and helped us to reach the nearest hospital safely the staff took all measures to safely reach the hospital and we have also seen many such incidents where the Mobile medical van helped many villagers and we all thank the staff for their humanitarian work”.

**SRDS will run the health camps** through their own funds or with support from local doctors. Patients will be nominally charged to cover expenses. The **Mobile Medical Van** will now service many more villages instead of the existing five. With increased footfalls, the program becomes achieves sustainability of scale. Collaborations with other CSR and hospitals will be explored to continue to provide primary healthcare to the doorsteps of villagers.

### 4. WASH (Water, Sanitation & Hygiene)

#### i) Safe Drinking water - RO Water Installation

**Need:** There was no proper drinking water source for the school in Harogiri. The borewell nearby had high fluoride content. Students brought water from their homes. Those who didn't drank the borewell water in very limited quantities. There was an immediate need to set up an RO filtration unit, so that students would have clean water to drink through the day.



In July 2023, we installed the RO drinking water facility to **Harogeri High School** where **150+ students** utilise this facility every day. This facility purifies the borewell water, making it potable and fit for drinking by students.



## ii) **Cleaning and covering of wells**

**Need:** Traditionally, wells have always held a sacred place in village homes. With the advent of packaged food and plastic, these wells degraded in their water holding capacity and became dump yards too. The open wells were contaminating the drinking water source becoming a hotspot for spread of diseases. SRDS, being noted for its water conservation efforts, impressed upon villagers the need to keep the wells clean.

We have cleaned and covered five wells from Peta Alur, Basapur, Harogeri & Kelur. Now they contain clean water and are covered, making it safe for animals children. The villagers are also happy and have been maintaining the wells.

### iii) Community Toilets

**Need:** Though the Hon. Prime Minister spoke about India becoming open defecation free in 2014, 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan' and much has been achieved, nearly a decade down the line, there are still villages which do not have toilets. The situation is more stark in the interior villages where schools don't have toilets, making it very difficult for girls. The girls in the Harogeri school did not drink water during the day because there was no toilet in the school. Therefore, SRDS decided to take up the construction of a toilet in the school and also community toilets in the village.

In keeping with the theme of Swacch Bharat Abhiyaan, SRDS has renovated and constructed 3 Community toilets – 2 in Basapur & 1 in Harogeri. The community toilets have been kept under lock and key by the families, so they are maintained well. The toilet in Harogiri, is a Pink toilet constructed for the 150 girl students of Harogiri school.

#### iv) Waste Management

**Need:** There was no proper waste collection system in the villages. There was increasing amounts of dry waste – paper and plastic being generated. These were being dumped in open places, along with vegetable waste, leading to cattle consuming the plastic. The Gram Panchayats were also interested to create a sustainable solution to this waste menace.

A multi-pronged approach was used by SRDS in association with SBI Foundation. We have provided **5 Waste Moving vehicles** to Harogeri Panchayat and this has helped them in collecting waste more efficiently and from more areas. At very little expenditure, large plastic bags were provided to collect the dry waste, which would in turn be collected by the Gram Panchayat and stored at one place. The Gram Panchayat also took interest and distributed dustbins to the all the households in the village. This has helped keep the village common areas clean and free of garbage.

#### v) Plastic Free Village

Among the adopted villages, we have made Kelur Village as ‘Plastic Free Village’. We have provided the bags to collect and once in 15 days we collect the plastics and keep it in one place.

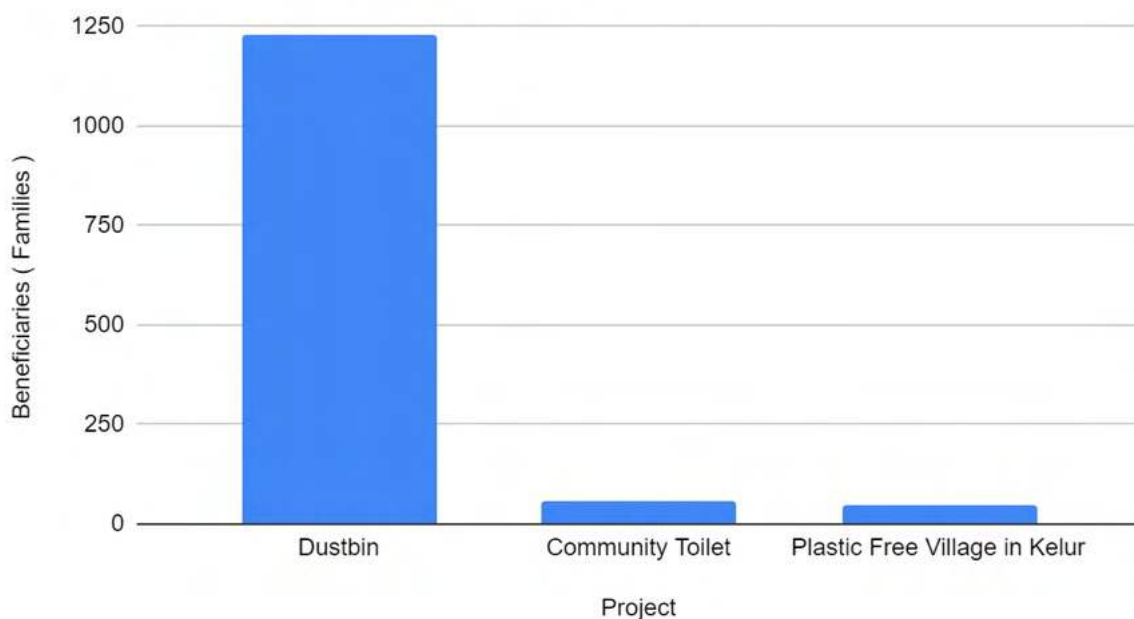
#### Outcome

RO water units have been installed in all five villages to provide clean drinking water to villagers. Pik toilet constructed at Petalur has really helped many girls and women. Waste management, Dry and wet dustbins, periodical Swatch Abhiyans, and ROs at schools are good examples of upgrading of health services.

**Case study:** Villagers are happy to drink clean water. RO water concept is a good one to tell the importance of pure water to the villagers. Anil and Kiran from Harogeri said, “We are thankful to the SBI foundation for helping us with the RO drinking water unit. Earlier we were worried about seniors, women, and especially children as most of them suffered from waterborne diseases every year. This year we are all safe”.

The RO unit has been handed over to the school development board for operations and maintenance. The Gram Panchayat has taken ownership over the **waste moving units** while the villagers themselves, especially women have pledged to keep the **toilets clean**. Since all the **open wells** were covered with mesh after the villagers agreeing for the need to keep the water clean, they have pledged to maintain the wells.

The Gram Panchayat of Kelur village is in talks with recycling units for them to purchase their **collected dry waste**, which will become a source of revenue for the GP too. The awareness programs conducted in all villages about using **dustbins** and keeping their village clean has been well received.

## 5. LIVELIHOOD AND SKILL DEVELOPMENT

### i) Skill development

Skill development enhances the proficiency of a person in any particular area. Skill enhances to build the professional network, better communication, time management and negotiation skills. Nurturing Talent: Skills are something that can be acquired by learning. Unemployed Youth/SHG Members/PwDs trained through SBI RSETIs /KVICs in the locality and Skill training/Capacity building also done through Convergence of various Departmental Schemes to ensure better livelihood opportunities.

**250+ youth/women** have been provided with skill development training in various courses like Tailoring, Embroidery and Career Counselling etc. by RSETIs, KVKs and other resource persons.

## ii) Tailoring and embroidery training

**Need:** Agriculture-based income is unpredictable. Sometimes it barely covers their expenditure. The women had a little extra time to spend on a new income-generating activity. Yet, they could not go out of their houses or villages to learn any new skill. Embroidery and tailoring was proposed to the women and they were excited to learn. This gave rise to the training initiative by SRDS and SBI Foundation.

During the reporting period, we conducted an embroidery training classes in the Basapur & Peta-alur villages. These classes are scheduled for 10 days where in **33 trainees per batch** got exposure to the basic stitching techniques, including chain stitching techniques. This training will help them stitch the basis embroidery designs on the dress or on the blouse.

On 29th April 2023 we started a tailoring class in Basapur, conducting 2 batches of 11 each.

Tailoring classes were started in the month of December 2022 in Basapur in collaboration with RSETI. At total **22 Women** joined the training and were taken to RESTI for the final exam and they were certified after finishing the training.

### iii) Poultry training

In the Month of January 23, we conducted Poultry Training for all Villages in Basapur Village total of 18 people took benefit of this training and were Certified by the RSETI

#### iv) Oil Mill in Peta-Alur

**Need:** Groundnut and Safflower are grown around the villages. Yet, people were purchasing edible oil in packets as they did not have an oil mill to extract the groundnut or safflower oil. Hence, they sold the crop at low prices. Given the demand for groundnut and safflower oil in cities like Gadag, Hubballi and Dharwad, SRDS with SBI Foundation decided to install an Oil pressing machine in Peta Alur village.

The Oil press machine was started in 2023 April in Peta Alur Village and it is working well. It has created a source of income for the SHG members and also a market for the farmers to come and get the oil from their oilseeds. Earlier they had to travel with their seeds for 20 Km but now they can get it processed in their own village.

#### v) Paper Plate Machine

**Need:** In order to diversify the income from the villagers, other avenues were being considered. With the availability of raw material for making paper plates in and around the villages, SRDS in collaboration with SBI Foundation, decided to set up a paper plate making machine, which had high demand in the urban areas.

In the month of June 2023, we have supported the women in Peta-alur village by presenting the Paper plate machine to their SHG. The SHG members were trained in operating the machine and since then they have sold more than 600 plates in the nearby villages. This will not only create an alternate income source but also increases the economic structure of the village.



## vi) Chilli Powder making machine

**Need:** Gadag is blessed with black cotton soil, ideal for growing chillies. However they sold all of them at low prices to the APMC. The women, wished they could get a chilli powder making machine which would give them an additional source of income.

The Chilli Powder making machine helps the women's SHG create a value-added processed product which fetches them a higher price compared to selling chillies directly.

## vii) Roti making machine

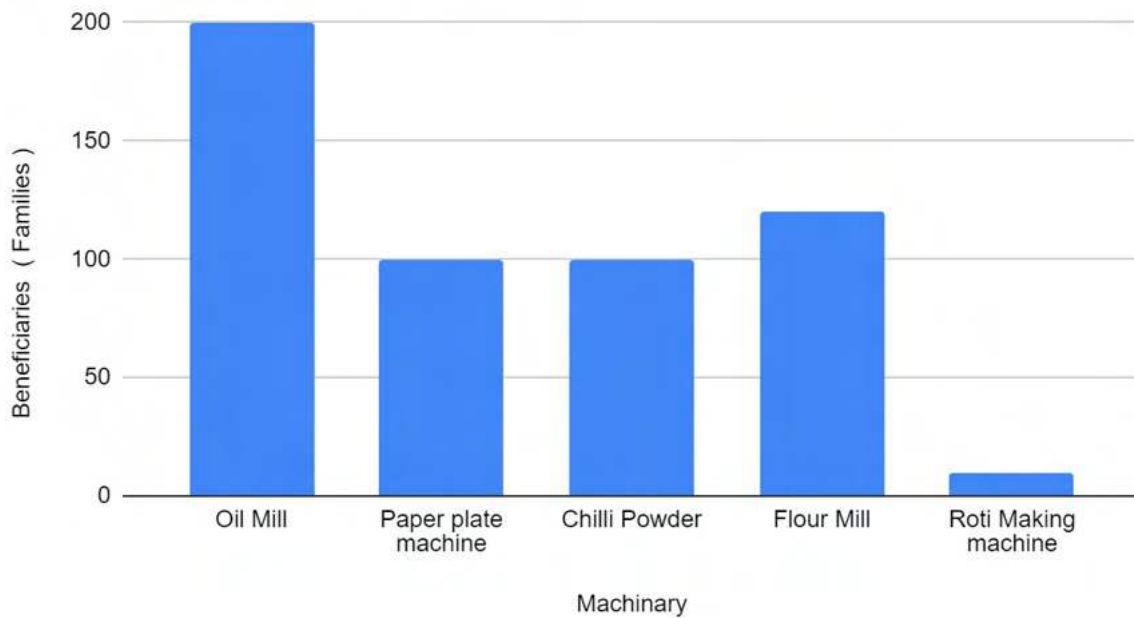
**Need:** As with the oil pressing machine, paper-plate pressing machine and chilli powder making machine, another income-generating source was identified as roti-making. The women are traditionally skilled in roti-making by hand. Due to the high demand in urban areas and even for export, a roti-making machine was procured.

The Roti making machine has been handed over to the SHG and adequate training for the same has been given. They are negotiating with the nearby dhaba for regular supply.

### SHG Entrepreneurial Support



### Outcome

After tailoring classes, many women are now earning money on their own and are getting orders from surrounding villages during festive seasons. Many resource persons have trained villagers on Poultry maintenance, Oil Mill training, paper plate machines, Chilly powder machines, Roti making machines, and others.

Many youth were trained in career counselling which is a new concept in villages like Peta-Alur, Harogeri, and others. Hundreds of youth got advice to choose the career of their interest through proper counselling.

**Case study for embroidery training:** A woman from Basapur said, “I had learned tailoring and now I have started on my own. Initially, it was slow but now I am getting good orders not only from Basapur but also from surrounding villages. I am thankful to the SBI foundation for training many of us to stand on our own legs. I am learning Rs. 600-700 in a good season”.

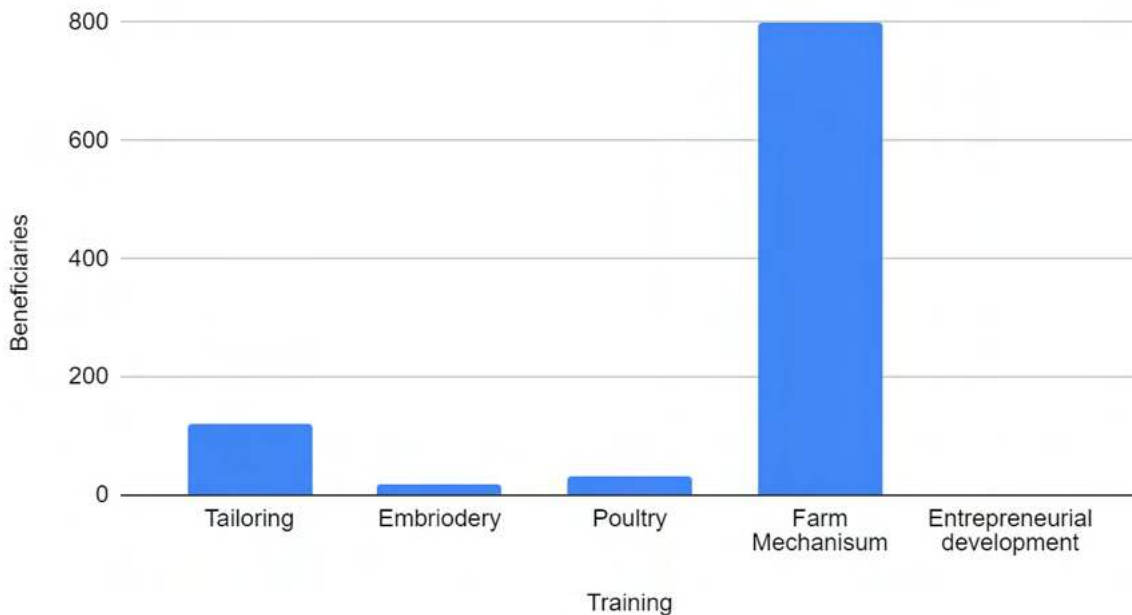

We have heard about campus interviews in big cities but this time we had it in our own village and we thank all SBI foundation staff”.

## Livelihood



## Sustainability Plan

- **Job fairs:** SRDS will continue to conduct job fairs at the villages with the support of local business in north Karnataka.
- **Tailoring and embroidery:** The ladies have become home entrepreneurs, marketing and selling their skills, with increasing revenues month on month.
- **Poultry training:** Poultry is a profitable business and villagers trained have started earning incomes, while increasing their stock.
- **Chilly powder machine/roti making machine/paper plate machine:** The women SHGs have contacted prospective customers like dhabas and restaurants for selling their products. SRDS will monitor and help these SHGs in become profitable enterprises.

## 6. SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE

Agriculture is the mainstay of rural India. When it is made profitable, it uplifts the entire rural economy. Since farming comes naturally to them, villagers have been introduced to methods that will increase their incomes. Hence several initiatives have been implemented like Raita Bandhu, sustainable water irrigation project, resilient agriculture, tree-based farming and livestock management to both diversify and increase farmers' income.

Sustainable agriculture also helps combat the effects of climate change which is creating wide variations in rainfall patterns. This is directly impacting the growth and yield of crops across the world. In resource-poor rural India, the farmers have to bear the brunt of the impacts of climate change. Resilient agriculture is an approach that includes sustainably using existing

natural resources through crop and livestock production systems to achieve long-term higher productivity and farm incomes under climate variability. Resilient agricultural practices are promoted to increase productivity and build sustainability. Farmers are supported with a package of practices like Farming system for crop diversification, Organic Farming, Horticulture, Seed Treatment and Proper utilization of Farm manure. Farmers are provided Farm Advisory Services through Gram Seva Kendra with reference to weather forecast and soil nutrient and pest management. Exposure visits were also arranged to local KVK/ Departmental Project Sites for cross learning experience.

### **i) Sustainable Water Irrigation project**

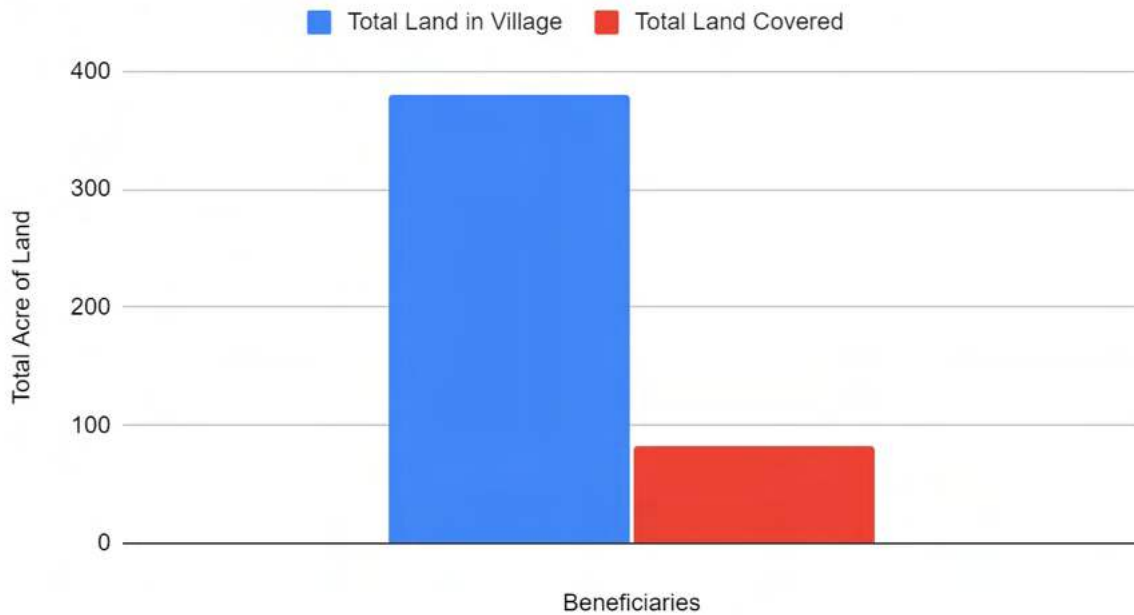
**Need:** There is a perennial stream that flows through Basapur village. It belongs to the Tungabhadra West Bank canal and always has water. There was no electricity connection to lift water from the stream. But there was also a diesel pump that was given by the Gram Panchayat. However, the distance from the stream to the fields was very long and farmers could not afford to lay pipes all the way. The farmers felt a need for laying sturdy pipes which will provide them water even during drought.

Hence irrigation work was started to provide water to **350+ acres** of land, benefiting almost all farmers directly or indirectly. Farmers contributed for excavation of the land. SRDS with SBI Foundation provided the pipes. Pipes are provided from the stream to the first corner of the land. From here they can draw water to enable them to grow 2 crops in a year. Till now 20 farmers out of 35 have taken the pipes and installed them in their farm.

### ii) Raita Bandhu

**Need:** Water is the greatest multiplier of income in agriculture. With climate change, there are many variations in rainfall patterns. Many times, there are bursts of heavy rainfall followed by long days of drought. Hence storing water when it rains is imperative for farmers to grow crops. A farm pond is an ideal water storage intervention which helps collect surface runoff and provides water during the lean period.

Raita Bandhu is a JCB which was inaugurated and handed over to the farmers by SBI Foundation President Mr. Lalit Mohan on March 2023. Raita Bandhu started operations from 16th May 2023. The JCB started its work in Peta Alur to implement water shed development for marginal and small farmers. The JCB is managed and maintained by SRDS, who charges 30% lesser than the market rate for creating trenches, farm ponds, and other dosing and land levelling work.

### iii) Resilient Tree-based Agriculture

**Need:** The short term cereal based crops were not yielding good profits for the farmers. Farmers were desperately looking for crops that would give them higher incomes. The villages we had considered were blessed with good soil and growing conditions for banana plants. A few rich farmers were growing banana and obtaining good yield from them. The other farmers also wished to grow banana but could not afford the saplings. Hence SRDS and SBI Foundation decided to present the banana saplings to the farmers, as a crop which would yield good incomes over the long term.

The intention was to promote agro-forestry among farmers. Farmers are usually reluctant to grow trees on their farms assuming they will not provide any income. By providing these agro-forestry species which will not only grow as a forest but also provide a stable income, farmers were supported.

High-yielding trees like Banana, areca nut, coconut, lemon, tamarind and mahogany plants in Harogeri and Peta-Alur village were distributed. Banana seedlings which were widely distributed are already giving returns to the farmers.

#### iv) Bee Keeping



In order to diversify farm income, bee keeping was promoted. Depending upon climate and plant life, it takes around 2 to 3 months to get the first honey production. This farmer Marlappa Budihal from Kelur has almost got his first honey harvest.

#### v) Livestock Development

**Need:** For farmers and those who owned land, we helped them with construction of farm ponds and tree-based farming. However, there are many landless labourers in the villages. Their income generation is uncertain and irregular, dependent on a variety of natural and economic factors. In order to provide them with an additional source of income, SRDS and SBI Foundation decided to give livestock for them to rear and sell. Goats and chicken were found to be low maintenance quick income generators. It was also decided to give them to women as they were thought to be more efficient in caring for them.

We supported 40 women during 2021 to take up supplementary income generation from Kelur, Basapur Village. The recipients paid only 20% of the cost. The lambs grow fast and within 2 years, the goat can be sold for as much as Rs. 12,000. Since the rearing is mainly done by the women, owning livestock makes them economically independent.

In January 2022, a Poultry Training program was conducted for all the villages in which we gave poultry. In Basapur village, 33 people benefited from this training and were Certified by the RSETI. And in February, we gave chicken to 41 beneficiaries from Kelur, Tamragundi, Basapur and Harogeri. To each beneficiary, we have given a total of 8 Chicken (7 Hen, 1 Rooster).

**vi) Farm mechanization**

**Need:** India abounds with small and marginal farmers. Manual and animal labour are all but things of the past. While the big farmers can afford to buy the required farm equipment, the small and marginal farmers usually shell out disproportionately high amounts to get the same work done.

Necessary farm equipment was identified in consultation with the farmers depending on the crops sown and processing necessary. During the harvest season, the seed separator machine is in full demand in the adopted villages. The seed separator machine is most widely used in the Bengal gram crop and needs only 2 labour to operate it. The same exercise done manually would've taken up to 10 labour. Pesticide pumps are also very well utilized in the Harogeri village.

**Contribution from the Communities:** We have received good community contribution towards use of the seed separator machine. A formal agreement has also done by the user groups for the sustainability of the assets. We have collected Rs. 10,070/- from tools till date.

Spray Machines, Seed Grader and Cono Weeder supported to Farmer's User Groups in the adopted villages of Karnataka State as per the need of the community on a pilot basis. Contribution from the Communities/ Farmer Groups are taken for maintenance of the equipment. A formal agreement has also been done by the users for sustainability of the assets.

## Outcome

Many farmers got to know about agricultural methods like Farming Systems, Seed treatment, and other advice. Many farmers grown Areca nut, coconut, lemon, tamarind, curry leaves, mahogany and others under Tree-based farming and the farmers are happy to have such advice from the organization. Diversification and integrated farming have also helped farmers achieve

sustainable source of income. These initiatives prove that when farmers are given the right advice and resources for implementation, they make the shift and reap rich harvests.

**Sustainable irrigation Case study:** Even during the drought year of 2023, farmers were able to irrigate their corn fields using the canal water through the pipes laid by SRDS and SBI Foundation. If the farmers’ profit previously was Rs. 10-12,000, now they have made a profit of Rs. 20,000 to Rs.30,000 in this drought year which would’ve been impossible without the pipelines.

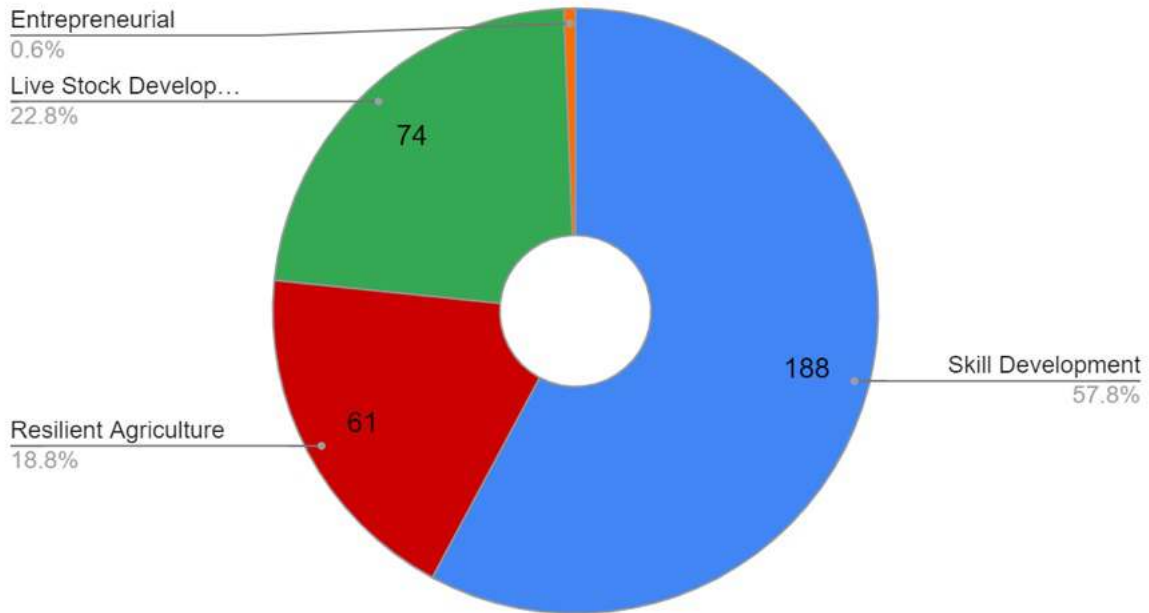
**Raita Bandhu Case study:** A farmer from Petalur said, “JCB machines are costly for farmers like us. We thank the staff of SBI Foundation who have provided the facility of using JCB machine in our village. Many farmers think twice before taking up some work because our village is one of the drought-hit villages of Mundargi taluk and farmers here have lost consecutive crops and amidst tough times, the SBI foundation came to our help”.

**Tree-based farming Case study:** Kelur village’s Maruti Timmapur has grown Banana plants and he is successful. Maruti Timmapur said, “I have got good advice from the staff of the SRDS and many farmers from surrounding villages are coming to see my farm”.

**Livestock management Case study:** A woman from Tamragundi said, “We are thankful to the staff for guiding us and helping us to get a parallel income from livestock rearing. We have seen others rearing these animals but never thought of taking them up as a means of income. SBI foundation helped us to know many things from this livestock rearing, especially poultry”.

## Sustainability:

- **Raita Bandhu:** SRDS will be managing the JCB, offering its services at less than market-rate to the farmers.
- **Bee-keeping, tree-based farming and livestock rearing** are self-income generating methods for farmers.
- **Farm mechanization:** Farmer SHGs will rent out the equipment to fellow farmers during the harvesting and sowing periods, monitored by SRDS.

Thus, these initiatives are not only sustainable but will have a positive ripple effect throughout neighbouring villages too.

## 7. STRENGTHNING OF SHGs & ADVOCACY

**Need:** Self-Help Groups are an excellent depiction of Unity in Strength. The members have similar living conditions, common problems and goals. When they come together, they have a stronger voice and procure and participate as a team in the process of economic independence.

Since 2020, we have created 20+ SHGs in the adopted villages and also conducted various programs like financial literacy and others which will help them negotiate for better terms in financial dealings and managing their own personal finances. We have supported them with over Rs. 30 lakh worth of financial support in the form of loans.

## 8. FITNESS & LEADERSHIP BUILDING

In order to promote recreation and allow rural residents to also enjoy modern amenities, five open gyms were installed in all the five adopted villages. These Open Gym equipment's can be used by anyone from children to elders. Many of the youth who are preparing themselves for physical examinations of competitive exams are very happy this equipment is available in their villages. The facility is used by over 50 villagers and students everyday.





## Outcome

**Case study:** Kiran, a parent of a child from Basapur said, “My child and my brother both are going to the gym now. We have been telling them to keep themselves fit but they used to answer that they do not have gym facilities like in metros. Thanks to SBI foundation and SRDS for installing modern gym equipment in our village”.

## Sustainability

Youth clubs have been formed to take care of the gym equipment. Since the equipment have been installed in front of schools, the school development board will take over. Other equipment have been installed in front of GSK, making it easy to monitor and maintain.

## 9. Networking and awareness creation

Several meetings were conducted at each village to brief villagers about the programs, take their opinions and build consensus among them for successful implementation of the programs. A number of educational and awareness building programs about government schemes were also conducted to enable villagers get benefits due to them.

We have conducted many awareness programmes in adopted villages to educate the villagers about the benefits from the government to help them become self-sustainable and educated them about the financial freedom and awareness about education of their children.

On the occasion of **Child Labour Prohibition Day** in June 2023, Our Convergence officer conducted a meeting in Basapur village for awareness about Act. A total of **20+ children** and their families were a part of this meeting.

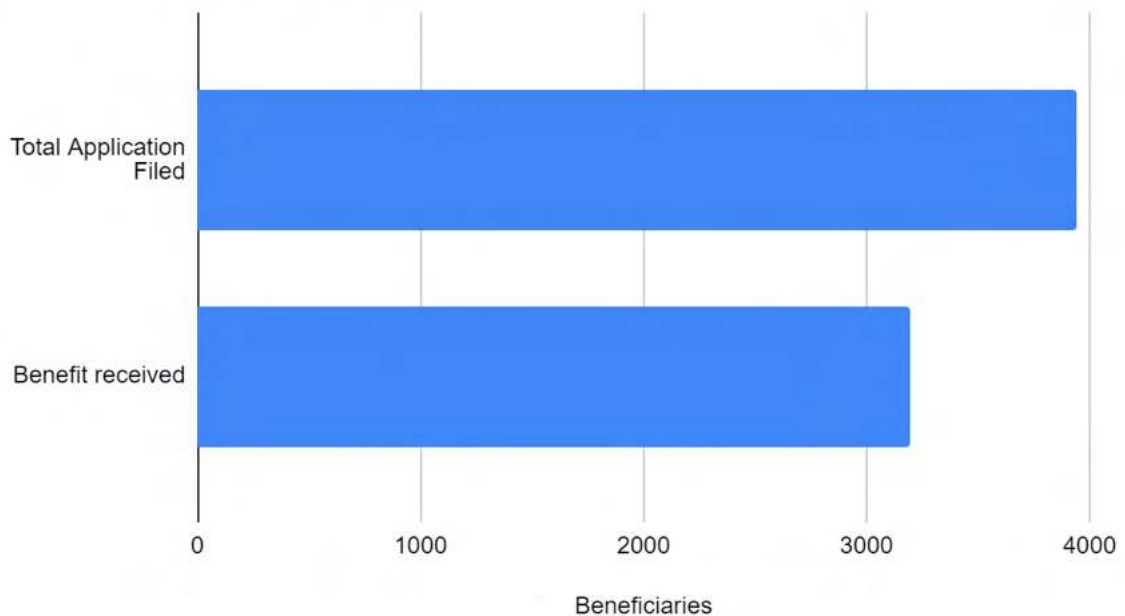

## 10. Rural Infrastructure

Infrastructure in the usual development paradigm is primarily concentrated to the big cities and large infrastructure projects like highways, bridges and dams. Rural infrastructure is left to develop at its own pace, without proper funding or human resources to build the required minimum infrastructure for citizens to engage in productive socio-economic activity. SBI Foundation together with SRDS brought about a number of assets which will be owned and managed by the respective village Gram Panchayat.

Community Buildings, Community Toilets, Bus Stands, Community Libraries, Meeting Platforms have been repaired/renovated across all the villages.

### i) Bus stands

**Need:** There was a single old bus stand at Peta-Alur village. Years of neglect had caused portions of the walls to break off and there was no seating inside the bus stop. Men would sit around the bus stop on the ground but it was difficult for the women to sit anywhere. Hence they had to wait for long hours until the bus arrived. Therefore, SRDS in collaboration with SBI Foundation decided to reconstruct the bus stand for the benefit of all, especially the women.

The Peta-Alur bus stand was rebuilt, painted and seats were also included. The villagers have found it very useful and it is being used all through the day. Women, especially are grateful for having a neat place to sit, while waiting for the bus.

### ii) Community library

A community library was also renovated in Pethalur village. After the renovation work, we have noticed an increasing number of youth and students coming over to read newspapers and for group study every day.

### iii) Street Lights

Villages have very low street-light penetration, leading to safety issues especially for women and children. During the reporting period, SRDS has installed 18 street lights in Basapur, Harogiri & Kelur villages to provide essential lighting in the adopted villages.

### iv) Public benches

Upon request from the villagers, we installed 5 benches with painting and branding in Kelur and Basapur villages. Post completing the work in Basapur village, we worked on installing the school benches in the Kelur village and in their school. In total, we have installed **5 benches in Kelur.**

**vi) Construction of laundry stones**

Laundry is an important daily chore and having good facilities make the chore less cumbersome. Hence this activity was also undertaken in Kelur village.

**vii) Solar Electrification**

Post installation of high beam street lights in all the adopted villages, the villagers feel relieved and contented as previously they faced a lot of issues and concerns due to no light in the remote areas. SRDS installed a new veterinary treatment stand in Tamragundi village as there was no facility for the farmers to get their animals treated. This will help the all the farmers and the veterinary doctor to treat the animals in a humane and safe manner for both the doctors and the animals who are usually scared during such treatments.

### x) Anganwadi painting

We received the request from the Anganwadies to renovate the anganwadi as the Anganwadis were old and not visually appealing. In reality, these are the places where children must love coming to every day. Hence repainting of all anganwadies were undertaken to make them attractive for small children to come and learn.

### xi) Kelur Water Trough

The construction of the Water Trough in Kelur village will benefit all the farmers in Village for their livestock drinking problem, especially in the summer and also help the people in reducing the death of livestock due to heatstroke.

This type of rural infrastructure, though small is very beneficial to the villagers and their livestock. They are a one-time construction which will serve the village for many decades.



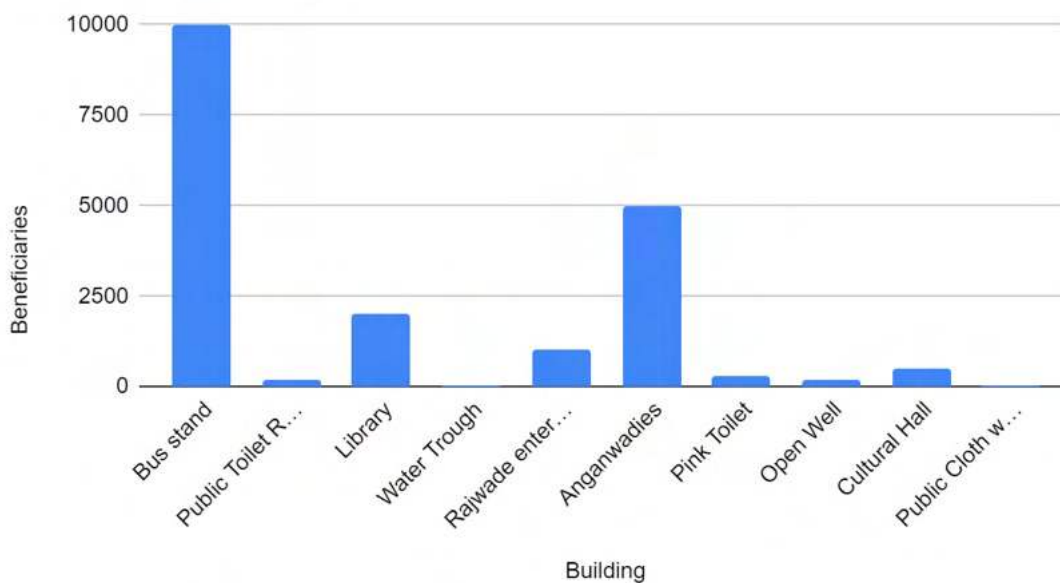

## Sustainability

All the built infrastructure has been handed over to the Gram Panchayat. The Gram Panchayat officials have assured us of maintaining them to the optimal standards. The anganwadis have been handed over to the Women and Child department, who will maintain them.

### 11. Environment

#### i) Water conservation

There is a scope for water conservation like rain water harvesting structures, rejuvenating old water structures in the adopted villages. During the reporting period, SRDS renovated 6 existing well in the village Pethalur & Kelur for providing safe & clean drinking water facilities to the community. Water Conservation related activities were carried out with the collaboration of Govt. Line Departments on need basis.

#### **Borewell recharge**

SRDS visited Kelur village and upon conducting several meeting with the farmers, 4 of them came forward to get the borewell recharge done. We have completed 2 borewell recharge in Kelur village and Peta-Alur village.

#### **Cleaning and laying of mesh over open wells**

SRDS has cleaned one open well in Harogeri village. We have also worked on putting the mesh (net) over the well to prevent dumping of waste and keeping the well safe for children and animals.

### **Check Dam work at Petalur and Harogeri**

The check dams are a type of agricultural construction that helps in protecting natural resources. These are built perpendicular to the flowing land of any waterways to obstruct the high-velocity flow, which helps in reducing erosion. The main objectives of the check dam projects were to recharge ground water reserves and increase the availability of water for agricultural purposes. Two check dams were built and handed over to the villagers on World Water Day.

### **ii) SBI Jan-Van**

As the trees disappear from urban areas, rural areas are the only places for afforestation activities SBI Jan Van has ushered in continuous tree-planting activities across the five villages. We regularly monitor the the SBI Jan Van site to make sure plants are intact. Watering and fertilizing the plants are supervised on a regular basis. Our CEO Mr.Sikandar Meeranayak is constantly monitoring we have implemented this successfully in Harogeri, Peta-Alur and the other villages.

We have created this Jan-van facility where we have planted around 300 plants and making it as a semi-jungle area where the trees are useful for the people and can also increase the Greenery, along with attracting flora and fauna.

### **Outcome**

The natural environment, soil and water resources have to be sustained and nurtured for the future generations. Through the water conservation activities and the Jan-Van program, SRDS has ensured two vital natural resources are conserved for all future generations.

### **Sustainability**

The check dams will be taken care of by the farmers who live near them. They will undertake desilting of the channels or approach the Gram Panchayat for the same work to be executed under NREGA. The open wells have been entrusted to the houses who live nearby as it is in their interest to maintain them. The watering of plants planted under Jan-Van will be monitored by SRDS until the next monsoon.

## **12. Events/Visits by Officials**
